

You may be eligible for help paying your telephone bill through these two programs:

The Lifeline Program is a federal one which offers a monthly discount up to \$9.25 on some landline telephone service plans and/ or Internet plans. Lifeline also offers discounts on some wireless telephone service plans and some broadband Internet service plans. You may receive the Lifeline discount on one service per household. The definition of a household is anyone living at an address including children, relatives, or people not related to you — who share income(s) and household expenses.

Minnesota's Telephone Assistance Plan (TAP) offers a monthly credit of \$10.00 on your landline telephone service. You can receive the TAP credit on one landline per household.

Qualifications

The telephone or broadband service must be in your name. You must show proof that you or a member of your household participates in at least one of the following programs or is income eligible:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Medicaid
- Federal Public Housing Assistance
- Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit Programs

If you do not participate in any of the programs listed above, you may qualify if your income is at or below 135% of the 2025 Federal Poverty Income Guidelines:

Fiber Optics Are Used for Much More Than Internet

As an Internet service provider, we often talk about the fiber optic cables we use to bring our customers incredibly fast and reliable Internet service. That's not surprising, since fiber has led to huge improvements in the online experience.

However, fiber optic cables are used in many other applications, including these:

Aerospace – The ability of optical fibers to withstand cryogenic temperatures enhance their suitability in space. They are used as sensors, communication cables, lighting, and more. Scientists are even experimenting with manufacturing fiber optic cable in space to achieve improved specifications in a zero-gravity environment.

Automobiles - Applications of fiber optics in automobiles include interior/exterior lighting and signal transmission between sensors and computing devices. Those sensors are often used to activate airbags and must be both fast and reliable.

Computer Networking – Schools, universities, business premises, and industrial plants typically use a local area network (LAN) — groups of connected computers or systems. Communication between LAN consoles is significantly easier when using fiber optics.

Lighting – Fiber optic cables are heat-free and durable, and they allow lighting to be directed precisely where it's needed. Since this lighting doesn't carry electrical current, it can safely be used in underwater spaces such as fountains or swimming pools.

Mechanical Inspections – Optical fibers are widely used to conduct mechanical inspections in cramped or difficult-to-reach places. For example, engineers use special cables called fiber optic probes to inspect the welding finish quality of the interior surfaces of stainless steel pipework, and plumbers use fiber optics to conduct in-depth inspections of interior sections of pipes, drains, and sewer lines.

Medical – Endoscopic surgery is dependent on fiber optics for lighting and viewing the site of the surgery. Dentistry uses fiber optic cables to direct a pinpoint of high-power light in the search for cracks and cavities in teeth.

Military – Fiber's low weight, immunity to electromagnetic interference, and security from interception make it excellent in military applications, ranging from underwater sensor systems to command and communication systems.

Best for Channel Flippers – Pluto TV (pluto.tv/us/on-demand) In addition to on-demand movie streaming for free, Pluto TV also has more than 250 live and linear channels on the platform.

Best for Roku Users – The Roku Channel (therokuchannel.roku.com) This platform is designed for people who own the company's streaming devices and TVs. You'll find thousands of free TV shows and hit movies, 400+ live TV channels, and more.

Best for Library Card Holders – Hoopla Digital (hoopladigital.com) This puts your public library at your fingertips. Borrow and enjoy audiobooks, eBooks, comics, movies, TV, magazines, or music everywhere you have a screen.

Best Revamped Service – Sling Freestream (sling.com/freestream) Sling Freestream offers more than 40,000 titles of free on-demand TV and movies and 500+ live TV channels. It's an expanded and rebranded version of Sling TV's former offering, called Sling Free.
